New Contact Lens Makes Glasses Obsolete

Monica Guterez has an unusual contact lens wearing schedule. She puts them in before going to bed and takes them out when she wakes up.

The lenses, described as an alternate to LASIK surgery, gently reshape Monica's cornea while she sleeps, allowing her to see clearly during the day. Wearing contacts during the day can be a hassle. The lenses pop out, need adjusting or can make the eyes itch. Contacts can be hard to wear in dry, dusty or smoky environments or while swimming.

Dawn says contacts are easier to wear at night. "When my eyes are closed, I hardly notice them" said Dawn who lives in Plainfield. Another advantage: If she gets up during the night to look after the children. I don't have to put on my glasses to see.

The corneal reshaping lenses can correct for all but the most severe nearsightedness as well as

many cases of astigmatism.

Nearsightedness is caused by a steepening of the cornea, the transparent tissue in front of the colored part of the eye. In the LASIK procedure, a doctor uses a

laser and surgical knife to flatten the cornea.

These special designed con-

tact lenses apply a slight pressure to the center of the eye, flattening the cornea and bringing the eye into focus. The lens must be worn nightly, or the cornea will revert to its original shape and the near sightedness will return. Many times some patients can get away with wearing the lenses every second or third night. The lenses are made out of an extended wear material. The material is gas permeable meaning it allows oxygen to reach the eye during sleep. The night lenses will appeal to people

who do not like wearing glasses or contacts during the day but leery of the LASIK surgical procedure. The LASIK patients often complain of halos at night and dry eyes and sometimes require a follow-up

> secondary procedure. Laser surgery did not seem like an option for me said Rod Hurst of Chicago. It is so permanent.

Hurst said his vision is better than 20/20."It's a miracle, I can see without anything in my eyes.

In a FDA study of 205 users, 4 percent dropped out because the lenses were uncomfortable. The study found that 67% of the patients had 20/20 vision or better and 95% had vision 20/40 or better.

Corneal Thickness adds breakthrough knowledge in Glaucoma

A new risk factor for glaucoma that is changing the way doctors evaluate a patient's chances of developing this eye disease has been discovered. It's called central corneal thickness. Among patients with elevated eye pressure - the main characteristic of the disease - those with thinner central corneal thickness measurements were found to have a higher risk of developing glaucoma.

Measuring central corneal thickness is a simple test done with an ultrasound machine. It's painless and brief, and the test is providing new clues to those who are at greatest risk for glaucoma and might benefit from early treatment of elevated eye pressure.

Glaucoma is actually a group of diseases that can lead to damage of the eye's optic nerve and loss of vision. Most of the diseases are characterized by increased fluid pressure in the eye. Glaucoma can affect anyone at any age. If detected early and treated, the condition can usually be controlled and sight preserved. The disease is often called "the sneak thief of sight", because if it is not caught early and treated effectively, it can lead to blindness. Well -known risk factors for developing glaucoma

include age, African descent, a family history of the disease and elevated eye pressure. Last year, a major government-funded study looked at a large group of patients with elevated intraocular eye pressure, but without signs of glaucoma such as nerve damage or loss of peripheral vision. Half of the patients were observed but not treated for the elevated pressure, and half were treated to lower their pressure. This study confirmed that Early glaucoma treatment with prescription eye drops used on the patients with elevated eye pressure, but no signs of glaucoma damage, was effective in delaying or even preventing the onset of the disease.


Glaucoma and Retinal disease **Nerve Fiber Analysis**

Glaucoma is one of the leading causes The disease is indicated by the deterioof preventable blindness in the United States. This year approximately 67 million people worldwide will suffer from this disease. About 2 million Americans have glaucoma but about half are unaware that they have the disease. Others will be diagnosed only when it is too late to save vision. Currently 800,000 Americans are legally blind from glaucoma.

Individuals at highest risk are those who are diabetic, near sighted, or have a history of eye injury or previous eye surgery, those with a family history of glaucoma, and for unknown reasons, African and Mexican Americans.

coma approximately half of the cases, and the visual fields test is only effective at the later stages of glaucoma, at which time considerable loss of nerve fiber and vision may have occurred.

These tests are approved for Medicare reimbursement and by many insurance plans.

Ocular Allergies: Finally there is Relief

Allergies are one of the most common diseases experienced by Americans. In fact, as many as 85 million people in the U.S. suffer from allergies. Airborne allergens and other particles can land directly on the surface of the eye, causing irritation and redness. Although tears constantly wash the eyes, they can't always keep out allergens like pollen or pet dan-

Those who have ocular allergies know that they are a major source of discomfort. They can contribute to eye dryness and other eye discomforts such as itchy, redness, swelling and watery. But beyond

being annoying, ocular allergies may be

very disabling. Allergic symptoms often interfere with everyday activities, such as reading, working on a computer, driving and playing sports.

Allergic eye symptoms may be seasonal, usually in the late spring or fall when pollen counts are the highest. This is com-

mon in persons with allergic rhinitis, asthma, and eczema or hay fever. Up to 80% of hay fever patients may have allergic eye conditions.

Ocular allergy occurs when histamine is released from mast cells. The symptoms

include burning, itching, watery discharge that is often white, thick ropey and is accompanied by nasal discharge and other allergic symp-

30-Day extended wear like wearing nothing at all

For many myopic consumers, tempted by laser surgery but squeamish about the procedure, extended-wear contact lenses seem to offer the ideal solution. They particularly suited, to busy and active nearsighted and farsighted patients, who are tired of wearing spectacles and unhappy with contact lens cleaning regimes. These patients may even find the routine of inserting and Until recently sleeping with conremoving daily disposable contact lenses a chore.

For all its convenience, the extended -wear contact lens has had to overcome a certain amount of bad press. The first examples of this lens, launched in the '80s, caused some user to complain of sore and red eyes. Since then, however, great leaps in contact lens technology have given birth to a new generation of materials that offer much higher oxygen transmissibility and whose

performance in clinical tests has been excellent.

Like all parts of our bodies, the cornea needs oxygen. When our eyes are open, even if we are wearing contact lenses, it is easy to obtain a sufficient amount of oxygen, but when we are asleep, with our eyelids closed, oxygenation is reduced to only a third.

tact lenses on had created another barrier to the flow of oxygen to the eye, but things have now changed because non-stop wear 30-

day, 24-hour contact lenses are now available. A recent research study showed that, for safe use during sleep, contact lenses must be able to transmit oxygen to at least 125 Dk level. While ordinary contact lenses have a reduced transmission of oxygen of about 25-35 Dk, 30-day lenses have a transmission of 175 Dk. Compared to normal disposable contact lenses, they enable up to 6 times more oxygen to reach the eye.

Extended wear contact lenses, for up to 30 days of continuous wear, give you undreamed freedom and convenience. However, these new

30-day extended wear are different from traditional soft lens con-
